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CHAIRMAN'S NOTE

Dear Stakeholders,

As many of you may be aware, GODHULI has been, over the past 28 years, educating thousands of underprivileged children and mainstreaming them to government schools. We have also been facilitating vocational training in popular Computer Courses, National Teacher's Training and Sewing Courses. A large number of our beneficiaries have now settled well in life and thank Godhuli – especially for having laid their foundation in the early years.

AS conveyed last year, we continue to run three centres at Meerabagh slums, Nangloi and Kalyanpuri where more than 500 children get free schooling, uniforms, books, bags, mid-day snacks and other interventions. A significant addition in the current year, was the commencement of afternoon shift in Nangloi wherein a total of 75 children are being educated in classes KG and 1st.

During the year we also continued with tutorial interventions for more than 50 middle school and high school kids besides computer certification courses for an average of around 30 youth at Meerabagh. We have recommended the Nursery Teachers Training course – another source of employment especially for young women.

The cost of operations of Godhuli have always been frugal wherein we have been able to limit the cost of one year's education of a child (inclusive of mid-day snacks, uniforms, books, bags, excursion trips etc) to around Rs. 8000 - 10000/-per child. This is possible only as our teachers happily work against a modest honorarium and our Governing Body members also contribute their time and resources, without taking any compensation from the Society. Our main source of funding comes from a handful of Corporate/Institutional donors such as Container Corporation of India (CONCOR) and IRCON International (both CPSEs under Ministry of Railways), Daya Gopal Amrit Trust, Bani Jagtiani Trust and Manibhai and Brothers Charitable Trust, to name a few. Besides various Samaritans from the public including quite a few personally known to the Governing Body members have also been contributing over the years.

All the same given the growing aspirations of the beneficiaries and other stake-holders, the receipt of funds from well meaning organizations and individuals are always welcome.

GODHULI'S Annual Report for 2022-23 is placed below for your perusal.

We invite you for being a part of our small but satisfying initiative by contributing in any manner – your time, resources or money as deemed appropriate. This will inspire us to work more spiritedly and also empower many more.

1. Introduction

GODHULI is a Charitable Society which was constituted in May 1994 and registered thereafter on 15.09.94, under Societies Registration Act 1860, . The Society aimed to take up projects for the basic education of street children in the age group of six to fourteen years, in terms of original Article 45 of the Constitution of India, (since amended vide Constitutional Amendment No. 86 of 2002), making it a Fundamental Right vide Article 21 A of the Constitution and vide Right to Education Act 2010, for imparting free and compulsory education to all children and revised Article 45 (placing responsibility on the State to provide education to all children up to the age of six years) under which free and compulsory education up to 14 years of age was to be provided to every child by January 26, 1960 which right continues to be denied to many Indian children to this day.

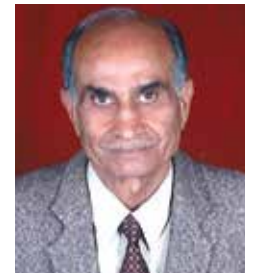

3. Teaching Philosophy

AIM

GODHULI primarily aims to provide free education to non-school going street/ slum children (age four plus), as envisaged under articles 24, 45, and 21A of the Constitution, and 'The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009', until they can be mainstreamed into the formal schools, and thereafter, to the extent possible, to mentor them so that they do not drop out. For selected students in Classes 6th to 12th, a project of providing Tutorial Classes has also been started from January 2022.

Teaching at Godhuli schools continues to be very interactive using practical methods. Students are learning while getting introduced to various ideas and subjects playfully and with enthusiasm. All efforts are made to increase their desire to learn in this way while at the same time they are prepared scholastically and provided with good groundwork to enhance their abilities to learn in their later years.

In addition to regular teaching, the children are also taught about their surrounding environment, likely pollution of air and water and prevention of the same and cleanliness and good manners. They are also introduced to basic good habits and moral duties as also to keep themselves strong physically, mentally, socially and spiritually.

Godhuli's basic motive is to help the students develop their inherent talents as also to identify their own hidden abilities. Special efforts are also made to interact with the parents so that the teachers are getting first-hand information about the normal activities of children as also identify reasons for their occasional absence. These meetings also help the teachers to evolve ways to wean these children away from mischievous activities. The school visits also help parents get sensitized and motivated to the need for children to continue their studies. The basic idea is to initiate various efforts leading to their eventual progress in life.

The provision of tutorials to students of Classes 6th to 10 th has also been continued during the year to supplement the scholastic efforts at their schools. Other than classes to cover the courses, the children are routinely made to participate in quiz competition and other innovative scientific experiments to make their learning even more joyful.

The students while being given completely free education are also provided with uniforms, school bags, books, stationery and other study material free of cost. Periodic Medical checkup including eye testing and provision of spectacles is also arranged in various centres.

Summer camps are normally also held in the Schools in May and June, when other schools normally close and cover various activities of learning, reciting rhymes, colouring, chanting mantras, physical activities of dancing, playing with toys, storytelling etc.

Attendance

During normal periods, the attendance in the schools remains quite satisfactory. Children look smart in their uniforms and have shown improvement in physical appearance.

It is very encouraging to note that the children and their parents show excellent response and there are hardly any cases of students dropping out from our schools.

National Day and Festivals

The schools normally observe Gandhi Jayanti, Independence Day, Republic Day, Diwali, Dussehra, BalDiwas, Christmas Day and New Year Celebrations. On these occasions the school premises are decorated with flags, balloons etc. and the functions include recitation of patriotic

songs and dance programmes by the students followed by award of prizes to winners and distribution of sweets.

In the current year, following Covid Protocols, most of the festivals were celebrated on line.

There are normally no vacations except Sundays and national and festival holidays, so that the children are not diverted away from education.

4. WORKING CENTRES

The following three centres operated during the year for the under privileged children. All the centres/schools are named as

BAPU-BA GODHULI SHIKSHA GRIH.

- **Meerabagh, PaschimVihar** (In two shifts)
- **Nangloi** (West Delhi)
- **Kalyanpuri** (East Delhi)

Meerabagh Centre also coordinated with nearby vocational training centre in providing Computer education to the youth of the area as also Nursery Teacher's Training as in the previous few years

4.1 MeeraBagh Centre

MeeraBagh Slums (B-Block), PaschimVihar, West Delhi

A) Primary Education

Godhuli is running this school for poor children from slums of Meera Bagh and Paschim Vihar. The school had been running in a temporary shed located in the the area. The shed structure was renovated recently in 2020-21 and thereafter incremental improvements continue to be effected.

The centre operates over two shifts - morning (8 AM to 12 PM) and Afternoon (12:40 to 4:40 PM) providing pre-primary and elementary education to 215 children and 90 children respectively.

During this year, following activities were carried out -

i) **Art & Craft summer camp** (15th May to 20 June 2022): Art and craft workshop was organized in which students from 1st to 3rd standard actively participated and demonstrated their ability. Activities included, reading writing, drawing competition, Sports competition, Quiz competitions.

ii) **Yoga Day** (21st June 2022): For betterment of the body and mind of students of school a session on yoga was held on International Yoga Day in which various Asans Pranayams Meditation etc. were demonstrated to and practiced by them.

iii) **Eye Camp** (23rd July 2022): An eye camp was organized with the help of Mahavir International. 160 students and 25 parents were administered eye checks and specs were given to 19 students and 10 parents free of cost.

iv) **Independence Day** was celebrated on 13th August 2022 in the presence of Godhuli Executives and other guests who appreciated the spirited performance of the children and encouraged them.

v) **On the Teachers Day** 5th September teachers and other staff members were given gifts by the Chairman - Dr. Y. Anand in the presence of other members of the Executive Body - Mrs. Veena Dixit, Dr. Navdip Kaur and Mr. K Narayan.

vi) **Gandhi Jayanti** (01st October 2022): On the event of Gandhi Jayanti a function was held in remembrance of father of our Nation. Sweets were distributed amongst the students. Further in order to enhance awareness amongst the whole community as well as the students of the school and otherwise, a Prabhat Feri was conducted in which all the students at the school participated.

vii) **On Diwali Festival** 22 October Sweets were distributed by Dr. Navdip Kaur, General Secretary Godhuli.

vii) **Children's Day** (14 November 2022): In the memory of Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, a cultural programme was conducted in which all the students of the school participated & enjoyed. On this day brief information about some of the great deeds accomplished by Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru was also shared with students. At the end of the programme the participants were distributed sweets. A quiz competition was organised for the students of 6th to 9th classes undergoing tutorial education at the centre. They also enacted some some skits and entertained the audience. On this occasion the tutorial students were distributed sweaters by the Vira Vision, women's wing of Mahavir International, Dehi - Godhuli's affiliate NGO

ix) **Supervisory Visit** (16 December 2022): A supervisory visit was conducted by CONCOR officials to assess the quality of education imparted and the general performance of students. The officials went back satisfied.

x) **Educational Trip** (24 December 2022): An educational trip was organized for recreation of the students of 2nd and 3rd standard of the centre. During this trip the students visited Dr. Bhagat Farmhouse, Gurugram, Sohna Haryana, where a host of plants and crops are being grown. During this trip the students played games, songs and other activities like rassa kassi etc. at farmhouse. Godhuli governing body members, teachers and supporting staff were present.

xi) **Rotary Club Delhi Janak Visit** (27 December 2022): A visit from Rotary Club Delhi Janak was done in order to sensitise the students specially about their teeth and health & hygiene. During visit they distributed toothpaste and brush to the students.

xii) 24 January 2023 - **Republic Day** was celebrated by both shifts students in the presence of Godhuli Governing Body members and teachers.

xiii) In March 2023 **Exams** were held. After **Art & Craft Sports Day** was organized, activities including Reading Writing (Hindi and English), Drawing Competition, Sports Competition, and Quiz Competition were conducted.

xiv) **Karate** training for students has been introduced since 2018-2019 session. Every student of the center is given training once a week. This has improved general, physical and mental strength of students and improved their general confidence level. Children observed with more talent are being given extra training for participation in competitions

xv) To the existing pool of around 270 books, 230 books have been added in the student library. Weekly distribution of books is being done for class 3rd children by rotation.

xvi) Details of mainstreaming of children of Meerabagh centre-

Details of mainstreaming of children of Meerabagh centre-

Morning Shift -

Out of 215 children enrolled, 106 students were mainstreamed into nearby MCD schools. 90 Students were promoted to 1st, 2nd and 3rd classes. 19 students are continuing in KG and 1st due to being underage and requiring further academic inputs.

Afternoon Shift -

Out of 90 children enrolled, 40 students were selected for mainstreaming in MCD schools. 28 Students were promoted to 1st, 2nd and 3rd classes, and 17 students were promoted to 2nd and 3rd. Five students are continuing in KG for same reasons as mentioned above.

B) Computer Literacy Programme:

With a view to enhancing skills of the students and to make them fit for gainful employment, computer training programme for 12th pass students from the slums was started in the year 2009 with only 6 students. So far twelve batches totaling **408** students have got trained. It is a matter of great satisfaction that the students who have undergone these computer courses have been able to get gainful employment. They are being regularly guided towards a respectable and bright future. All expenses for these courses are met with by Godhuli.

During the year 2022-23, the 13th and 14th batches comprising of 24 and 28 students respectively were successfully trained and certified in Certificate in Advanced Computer Software (CACS), Diploma in Additional Financial Accounting (DAFA) and Web Designing.

C) Nursery Teacher Training (NTT):

It had been observed that some young women residing in slum areas want to adopt Teaching as a profession. This prompted Godhui to start the first batch of the one-year Nursery Teacher's Training (NTT) courses for 10 students in August 2016. Three batches have been completed so far. All expenses of the courses are borne by Godhuli. Another course is being currently commenced.

D) Tutorial Education:

Noticing the fall in the academic levels of children in Meera Bagh slums owing to cessation of conventional school for nearly two years, Godhuli commenced tutorial education (with the help of a donation from a U.S based Indian Philanthropist) for children of classes 6th to 9th in December 2021. Around 45 students were initially enrolled in the programme, which entailed classes in the three traditional tough subjects of English, Mathematics and Science. The performance of these children in their school assessment have been quite encouraging.

Encouraged by the results, tutorial education was continued in the year 2022-23 with 60 students of classes 6th to 9th being enrolled in the programme. The classes taken by professional tutors involves not only remedial education in the conventional subjects, but also other initiatives like experiments to prove scientific facts, quizzes etc to make school education more interesting. All the students have been promoted to next classes, with most registering healthy improvement in all three subjects.

4.2 Nangloi Centre

Sainy Chaupal Colony

Nangloi, New Delhi – 110041

This school in Nangloi was started in April, 2016 for KG class for street / slum children of the area after entering into an agreement with the Saini family who have made available their premises for the said activity.

Learning at Godhuli is multifaceted as we encourage the students to improve their knowledge , basic habits and moral duties while growing strong physically, mentally , socially and spiritually.

Within a short span of time, the school has gained immense popularity among the poor population of the area.

During this year, following activities were carried out -

i) The construction of new building was started in April 2022, It was completed by June end 2022. During this period school was shifted in another rented building so that students don't suffer.

ii) We admitted 90 students in rented building, But after the inauguration of new building, we increased the strength of students from 90 to 105 .

iii) On 1st July 2022 New building was inaugurated by Godhuli Board Members and Sainy family .

vi) Independence Day was celebrated on 13th August 2022 in the presence of Godhuli Executives .

v) On the Teachers Day 5th September - presented gifts by Dr Y P Anand, chairman in presence of other Governing Body members.

vi) We started noon shift from 1st October 2022 for the children between 4- 10 years age .

vii) Now for the students from 4-8yrs of age, we are having two classes of KG and First in the noon shift.

viii) Karate classes were continued for both shifts students on every Wednesday.

ix) On Diwali Festival 22 October Sweets were distributed by Mrs Santosh Bansal, Governing Body member in charge of Nangloi centre.

x) Our small children of morning shift performed in a program ,based on 'Dadi Amma Dadi Amma Maan Jao 'song, at NCUI Auditorium on 19 November 2022 participated in Eye Care Day organised by Mahavir International, Delhi.

xi) Xmas was celebrated on 24th Dec.

xii) 24 January 2023 - Republic Day was celebrated by both shifts students combined in the presence of Godhuli Executive and Sainy family members .

xiii) On 28 th January 2023 An Eye Camp was organized with the help of Mahavir International . 87 students and 12 parents were checked and specs were also given to four children and seven adults. Free of cost.

xiv) On 30 th January 2023 students prayed in the remembrance of Rashtrapita Mahatma Gandhi 's 75 th 'PUNY TITHI '

xv) In March 2023 Exams were held and Sports Day was organized.

Details of mainstreaming of children of Nangloi school-

Morning Shift -

Out of 105 students, 88 were mainstreamed in other schools, two were admitted in first class in our noon shift and 15 are in KG class in morning shift. (under age)

Afternoon Shift -

i) 8-10 years... Out of 15 students, 08 have mainstreamed, admission under process for 04 nos. and 03 have migrated to village

ii) 6-8 years... Out of 25 children 18 have been mainstreamed and for rest process is under progress.

iii) 4-6 years... Out of 35 students, 12 students have been mainstreamed in other schools and three are under process. 8 children are admitted in first class in our school, five are readmitted in KG (under age) and seven have gone to their village.

Basti Vikas Kendra, Near Dhobi Ghat, Kalyanpuri, Delhi – 110091

The school has been functioning satisfactorily since November 2015. when Delhi Govt. had allotted two rooms in the local Basti Vikas Kendra in a cluster of slums .

Children in age group 4-6 years are taken in KG class and prepared for taking up further school studies.

Immediately after the school opens for a new session, the teachers regularly visit the locality households to motivate/bring the children to school.

Mainstreaming

15 children were mainstreamed during the period 01.04.2022 – 31.03.2023.

Current enrolment and attendance

30 – 35 children were enrolled during the year 2022-2023 and 25- 30 children attended the school regularly.

Infrastructure improvement

i) Four additional mats (5 m x 0.45 m) were procured for the use by the children .

ii) Water Supply System to the two toilets was restored and made functional.

iii) Repair work was carried by locally available mason. It involved repair of a wall and leaking ceiling.

Visit by the representative of local MLA : Shri Vinod Mishra , a representative of local MLA visited the school on 09th June 2022. He was suitably briefed about Godhuli and the school activities.

Activities in association with other organizations

Cancer Awareness Camp : A camp was organized by an NGO viz Centre for Advocacy and Research (CFAR) with the help of Cancer Society Of India at the venue of our School on 07.01.2023 for the benefit of residents of nearby areas, 115 persons were examined and advised. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with another NGO viz Shakti Foundation has been signed for holding remedial/tutorial classes by Shakti Foundation in the venue of the school after the activities of Babu-Ba Shiksha Grih. The classes would be conducted by Shakti Foundation for students of nearby areas. No fee would be charged; the students up to class eight are expected to be benefitted.

5. Closed Schools

5.1 Patparganj School

In May 1995, GODHULI started a primary school at Patparganj, East Delhi. The School was being run in a building of the MCD and GODHULI provided education, study materials and school uniform, all free. The school was discontinued w.e.f. 1st August, 2008 when all students were mainstreamed due to Government Policy.

5.2 Khichripur School

This school was started in 2009 at Khichripur, Delhi-110091 and had two KG classes for children in age group 4 to 6 years. This school had, however, to be closed w.e.f. 1st April 2014 due to withdrawal of accommodation by the authority.

5.3 Sagarpur School

The Sagarpur centre was started in 2011 in collaboration with CMM Charitable Trust, Godhuli had to terminate the arrangement due to paucity of students because of mushrooming of other Govt.schools and Aanganwadis in that area. and the centre was closed down in May '2020.

7. Registration under FCRA and other Government Regulations

Godhuli has been registered under Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 1976 for accepting donations in foreign currency without prior permission from the Ministry of Home Affairs under Registration No. 23166824 of March 2019. For this the Society has opened account no. 40108898935 in State bank of India, New Delhi main Branch.

Godhuli is additionally registered with NGO Darpan Portal of Govt. of India with ID No.DL/2018/0187530.

Godhuli also stands registered with Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) as an entity authorized to undertake CSR activities with Registration No CSR00003127

8. Exemption from Income Tax

All donations to the GODHULI are exempt from Indian Income Tax under Section 80(G) of the Act, vide order dated 02-10-2021 issued by Principal Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemptions), The exemptions stand valid till Assessment Year (AY-2026-27). The Society is also registered under Clause 12 A of the IT Act for a period co-terminus with the 80G exemptions.

9. Office of Godhuli

Godhuli's registered office is at 513, Sector A , Pocket C , VasantKunj, New Delhi – 110070. The space for its administrative office has been very kindly provided for by Dr. C.M.Bhagat, Vice Chairman –II at his hospital premises in the 1st Floor of Bhagat Chandra Hospital, RZF-1/1, Mahavir Enclave, PalamDabri Road, New Delhi.

12. Tasks for next year

During the next year, the main task before the Society would be to bring back normalcy in its activities in accordance with the prevalent Government instructions and streamline its functioning after a long period of disruption. In addition extra efforts would be made –

- To ensure that children of centres at MeeraBagh, Kalyanpuri and Nangloi are brought back to normal teaching levels and special efforts are made to bridge the deficiencies

- To mobilise and motivate children to restart physical attendance in full strength
- To continue the vocational education interventions for under privileged youth of the Meerabagh/Nangloi area in Computers and NTT till such time as prevalent conditions normalise
- Arrange regular Medical check-up camps for students.
- To continue updation of the renovated Nangloi School Building in consultation with the Saini Family.
- To strengthen the involved systems for the newly started Tutorial Classes at Meerabagh by way of increase in number of students, adequacy of attendance, systematic follow-up of the syllabus and involvement of parents.

13. Visit to Schools
