ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2023-24



Dear Stakeholders,

Thanks to the unstinting yet silent support of many noble souls like you, GODHULI has entered its 30th year of existence. AS one of the founding members, I must frankly admit – that we never imagined way back in 1994 that Godhuli will reach a stage where we are helping carve destinies of more than 500 children and youth and their families every year.

During the year bygone, we continued to run three centres at Meerabagh slums, Nangloi and Kalyanpuri where more than 500 children get free schooling, uniforms, books, bags, mid-day snacks and other interventions. Two of the centres, namely Mirabagh and Nangoli continued to educate children over two shifts thereby making optimum use of the space. In fact Mirabagh centre also conducts stitching classes for around 20 women.

During the year we also continued with tutorial interventions for 60 middle school and high school kids at the Mirabagh centre. While results of class 7th was exceedingly good (given that the children have been with us from Class 6th, what was even more satisfying was that children in 10th secured around first division or better! Vocational Training by way of computer certification courses in Basics, Tally and Graphic designing as also Nursery Teachers Training was facilitated at Shing Doon Academy in Jwala Heri for around 20 students. You will be pleased to note that Godhuli added a new feather in its cap by starting Adult Education for around 25 women at our Nangloi centre. This project has been started in March' 2024 with support of Rotary Club Janak.

A conscious effort is being made to enhance the quality of interventions for the children – especially those in classes 1st to 3rd, as their basic education has suffered adversely during the tough COVID years. Same is true for the tutorial students. With the said objective in mind, Godhuli is ensuring that all its teaching staff also undergo Nursery Teacher's Training. Considering that they too come from modest background, the programme is also being funded by Godhuli.

AS conveyed last year, the cost of operations of Godhuli continues to be frugal wherein with the cost of one year's education of a child (inclusive of mid-day snacks, uniforms, books, bags, excursion trips etc) limited to around Rs. 8000 - 10000/-. This is possible only as our volunteer teachers happily work against a modest honorarium and our Governing Body members also contribute their time and resources, without taking any compensation from the Society. **Our main source of funding comes from a handful of Corporates/Institutional donors such as Container Corporation of India (CONCOR) and IRCON International (both CPSEs under Ministry of Railways), Daya Gopal Amrit Trust, Bani Jagtiani Trust and Manibhai and Brothers Charitable Trust, to name a few. Besides various Samaritans including quite a few personally known to the Governing Body members have also been helping over the years.**

Last but not the least a special mention is due for Bhagat Chandra Hospitals, who have so kindly provided Godhuli office space besides various other facilitation.

All the same given the growing aspirations of the beneficiaries and other stake-holders, the receipt of funds from well-meaning organizations and individuals are always welcome. This is all the more now a need, as encouraged by the patronage of our well wishers and in response to the unfulfilled requirement of kindergarten interventions for the slum children, we have commenced two more centres in Palam Gaon and Vikas Puri in the first quarter of 2024-25.

We invite you for being a part of our small but satisfying initiative by contributing in any manner – your time, resources, money or just connecting us with someone who can help Godhuli in any manner. This will inspire us to work more spiritedly and also empower many more.

1. Introduction – Our Objectives

GODHULI is a Charitable Society which was constituted in May 1994 and registered thereafter on 15.09.94, under Societies Registration Act 1860, . The Society has aimed to take up projects for the basic education of street children in the age group of six to fourteen years, in terms of original Article 45 of the Constitution of India, (since amended vide Constitutional Amendment No. 86 of 2002), making it a Fundamental Right vide Article 21 A of the Constitution and vide Right to Education Act 2010, for imparting free and compulsory education to all children and revised Article 45 (placing responsibility on the State to provide education to all children up to the age of six years) under which free and compulsory education up to 14 years of age was to be provided to every child by January 26, 1960 which right continues to be denied to many Indian children to this day.

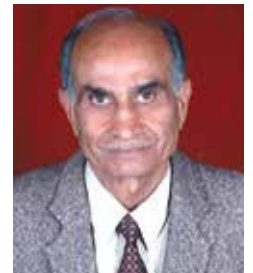

3. Teaching Philosophy

Teaching at Godhuli schools has always been very interactive using practical methods. While learning, the students are getting introduced to various ideas and subjects playfully and with enthusiasm. All efforts are made to increase their desire to learn while at the same time they are prepared scholastically and provided with good groundwork to enhance their abilities to learn in their later years.

In addition to regular teaching, the children are also taught about their surrounding environment, likely pollution of air and water and prevention of the same and cleanliness and good manners. The students are also introduced to basic good habits and moral duties as also to keep themselves strong physically, mentally, socially and spiritually.

Godhuli's basic motive is to help the students develop their inherent talents as also to identify their own hidden abilities. Special efforts are also made to interact with the parents so that the teachers are getting first-hand information about the normal activities of children as also identify reasons for their occasional absence. The Parent-Teacher meetings also help the teachers to evolve ways to wean these children away from mischievous activities. The school visits also help parents to get sensitized and motivated to the need for children to continue their studies. The basic idea is to initiate various efforts leading to their eventual all round progress in life.

The provision of Tutorials to students of Classes 6th to 10th has also been continued during the year to supplement the scholastic efforts at their regular schools. Other than classes to cover the syllabus, the children are routinely made to participate in quiz competitions and other innovative scientific experiments to make their learning even more joyful.

The students, while being given completely free education are also provided with uniforms, school bags, books, stationery and other study materials free of cost. Periodic Medical checkup including eye testing and provision of spectacles is also arranged in various centres. During the year Adult Education Programme has also been started.

Summer camps are normally also held in the Schools in May and June, when other schools normally close and cover various activities of learning, reciting rhymes, colouring, chanting mantras, physical activities of dancing, playing with toys, story telling etc.

4. Working Centres

The following three centres operated during the year for the under privileged children. All the centres/schools are named as

BAPU-BA GODHULI SHIKSHA GRIH.

- **Meerabagh, PaschimVihar** (In two shifts)
- **Nangloi** (West Delhi)
- **Kalyanpuri** (East Delhi)

Meerabagh Centre also coordinated with nearby vocational training centre in providing Computer education to the youth of the area as also Nursery Teacher's Training as in the previous few years.

Nangloi Centre started Adult Education Programme for the ladies of the colony.

4.1 MeeraBagh Centre

MeeraBagh Slums (B-Block), PaschimVihar, West Delhi

A) Primary Education

Godhuli is running this school for poor children from slums of Meera Bagh and Paschim Vihar. The school had been running in a temporary shed located in the the area. The shed structure was renovated recently in 2020-21 and thereafter incremental improvements continue to be effected.

The centre operates over two shifts - morning (8 AM to 12 PM) and Afternoon (12:40 to 4:40 PM) providing pre-primary and elementary education to 215 children and 90 children respectively.

During this year, following activities were carried out -

i) **Art and Summer Camp (May-June 2023)**: Art and craft workshop was organized in which students from 1st to 3rd standard actively participated and demonstrated their ability. Activities included, reading writing, drawing competition, Sports competition, Quiz competitions.

ii) **Yoga Day (21st June 2023)**: For betterment of the body and mind of students of school a session on yoga was held on International Yoga Day in which various Asans Pranayams Meditation etc. were demonstrated to and practiced by them.

iii) **Cancer and Dental Check up Health Camp (08th December 2023)**: The cancer detection camp was organized with the help of Rotary Club,, Delhi Janak. 158 students and 96 (female) parents were registered for cancer and health check up out of which only 31 female parents were required to be examined and follow up action taken.

iv) **Independence Day** was celebrated on 12nd August 2023 in the presence of Godhuli Executives and other guests who appreciated the spirited performance of the children and encouraged them.

v) **On the Teachers Day (5th September 2023)** Teachers were told about Dr. Sarvepalli Radha Krishna and his contributions. Many students sang songs and poems during this session. Teachers were duly appreciated for their contributions in guiding the students.

vi) **Gandhi Jayanti (02nd October 2023)**: On the event of Gandhi Jayanti a function was held in remembrance of the father of our Nation. Sweets were distributed amongst the students. Further in order to enhance awareness amongst the whole community as well as the students of the school and otherwise, a Prabhat Feri was conducted in which all the students at the school participated.

vii) **On Diwali Festival 11th November, 2023** attended by Dr. Navdip Kaur, General Secretary and Mr. K.Narayan, Treasurer Godhuli. The children were interacted with and distributed sweets.

vii) **Children's Day (14th November, 2023)**: In the memory of the country's first Prime Minister - Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, a cultural programme was held in which all the students of the school participated & enjoyed. On this day brief information about some of the great deeds accomplished by Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru was also shared with students. At the end of the programme the participants were distributed sweets. A quiz competition was organised for the students of 6th to 9th classes undergoing tutorial education at the centre.

ix) **Supervisory Visit (01 December 2023)**: A supervisory visit was conducted by CONCOR officials to assess the quality of education imparted and the general performance of students. The officials went back satisfied.

x) **Educational Trip (22 September 2023)**: An educational trip was organized for recreation of the students of 2nd and 3rd standard of the centre. During this trip the students visited Aryabhata Science Museum, Tagore Garden. On the trip the students learnt about different species of Dinosaurs., The Solar System and Chandrayan II and III by the teachers and staff of the museums. During this visit the teachers and staff members were also present. Enthused by its success, a similar trip was organized for the students undergoing tutorial education.

xi) **Teacher's Training (Pocso Act)** (06 April 2023) A Teacher Training was organized by Godhuli in Meerabagh Center . Mr. Chanchal , Resource person SPYM, explained the nuances of Sexual Harassment of children and gave some insights as to how the teachers can identify the children undergoing such traumatic experiences.

xii) 25 January 2024 - **Republic Day** was celebrated by both shifts students in the presence of Godhuli Governing Body members and teachers.

xiii) In March 2024 after the Exams were held **Art & Craft Sports Day** was organized, activities including Reading Writing (Hindi and English), Drawing Competition, Sports Competition, and Quiz Competition were conducted.

xiv) **Karate training** for students has been introduced since 2018-2019 session. Every student of the center is given training once a week. This has improved general, physical and mental strength of students and improved their general confidence level. Children observed with more talent are being given extra diet and training for participation in competitions

xv) To the **existing pool** of around 450 books, 380 books have been added in the student library. Weekly distribution of books is being done for class 3 children by rotation.

xvi) **Details of mainstreaming of children of Meera Bagh centre-**

Morning Shift -

Out of 215 children enrolled, 102 students were mainstreamed into nearby MCD schools. 99 Students were promoted to 1st, 2nd and 3rd classes. 28 students are continuing in KG and 1st due to being underage and requiring further academic inputs.

Afternoon Shift -

Out of 90 children enrolled, 21 students were selected for mainstreaming in MCD schools. 34 Students were promoted to 1st, 2nd and 3rd classes, and 26 students were promoted to 2nd and 3rd. Six students are continuing in KG for same reasons as mentioned above.

B) Computer Literacy Programme:

With a view to enhancing skills of the students and to make them fit for gainful employment, computer training programme for 12th pass students from the slums was started in the year 2009 with only 6 students. So far Fifteen batches totaling 484 students have got trained.

It is a matter of great satisfaction that the students who have undergone these computer courses have been able to get gainful employment. They are being regularly guided towards a respectable and bright future. All expenses for these courses are met with by Godhuli.

However a nominal refundable security deposit of Rs 500/- is being taken to ensure that the students remain serious in their pursuits.

To ensure that only deserving and interested students avail of this opportunity, the applicants are being intensively counseled pre-selection and only those showing some aptitude or attitude are being selected for the course. During the year 2023-24, the 15th and 16th batches comprising of 9 and 5 students respectively were successfully trained and certified in Certificate in Advanced Computer Software (CACS) and Diploma in Additional Financial Accounting (DAFA).

C) Nursery Teacher Training (NTT):

The year saw recommencement of the Nursery Teachers Training after a hiatus. The 5th batch involved induction of trainees in two phases. A total of 9 students underwent the training which included some teaching volunteers of Godhuli from our Meerabagh and Nangloi centres. Both the above training programmes are being conducted Shining Doon Academy – who are affiliated to Lal Bahadur Shastri Institute. The academy is periodically visited by our Manager and members for assessing the quality of training and seriousness of the trainees.

D) Tutorial Education:

Noticing the fall in the academic levels of children in Meera Bagh slums owing to cessation of conventional school for nearly two years, Godhuli commenced tutorial education (with the help of a donation from a U.S based Indian Philanthropist) for children of classes 6th to 9th in December 2021, which entailed classes in the three traditional tough subjects of English, Mathematics and Science.

Tutorial education was continued in the year 2023-24 with 55 students of classes 6th to 9th being enrolled in the programme and around five students in class 10th. The classes taken by professional tutors involves not only remedial education in the conventional subjects, but also other initiatives like experiments to prove scientific facts, quizzes etc to make school education more interesting. All the students have been promoted to next classes, with most registering healthy improvement in all three subjects.

4.2 Nangloi Centre

**Sainy Chaupal, Lakshmi Park,
Nihal Vihar, Nangloi,
New Delhi - 110041**

This school in Nangloi was started in April, 2016 for KG class for street / slum children of the area after entering into an agreement with the Saini family who have made available their premises for the said activity.

Learning at Godhuli is multifaceted as we encourage the students to improve their knowledge, basic habits and moral duties while growing strong physically, mentally, socially and spiritually.

Within a short span of time, the school has gained immense popularity among the poor population of the area.

During this year, following activities were carried out -

- i) 105 Students were admitted in the Morning Shift in KG Class, divided in three sections. In noon shift 80 students were enrolled, 40 students (4-6 years) in KG and 40 students (6-8 years) in first class.
- ii) **Karate Classes** were continued for students of both shifts on every Wednesday.
- iii) **Independence Day** was celebrated on 12th August 2023 by students of both shifts (combined) in the presence of Dr. Y.P. Anand and other Godhuli Executives along with Sainy Family.
- iv) An **Eye Check Up** Camp was organized on 25th September, 2023 with the help of Mahavir International, Delhi. Students and parents were checked and Spectes were given to 4 children and 3 adults, free of cost.

- v) **Women's Health** Session was organized by Rotary Club members on 13th October, 2023.
- vi) **Diwali and Children's day** were celebrated in the presence of Mrs. Santosh Bansal and the teaching staff.
- vii) **Christmas Day** was celebrated on 24th December, 2023 by the Teachers and Staff.
- viii) **Cancer Detection Camp** was organized on 29th December'2023 by Janak Rotary Club members with the help of Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Hospital Unit.
- ix) **Republic Day** was celebrated on 25th January' 2024 by students of both shifts in the presence of Dr. Anand, Dr. Bhagat, Mr. Narayan, Dr. Navdip Kaur, Mrs. Santosh Bansal and Sainy Family.
- x) On 30th January' 2024, students prayed in remembrance of Rashtrapita Mahatama Gandhi.
- xi) Adult Education Programme has been started during the year in evening with the help of Rotary Club, Janak.
- xii) To celebrate Women's Day a workshop was organized by Mahavir International on 6th March, 2024, to educate pregnant Women.
- xiii) Final Exams were held on 15th March to 21st March , 2024 and Sports and other competitions were organized from 22nd to 26th March.
- xiv) Result distribution and PTM was held on 30th March' 2024.
- xv) Mainstreaming of Children

a) **Morning shift**

1. Out of 105 Children enrolled , 88 nos. were selected for mainstreaming in MCD and Private Schools.
2. 6 students are continuing in KG Class due to being underage.
3. 5 students are admitted in Class I in the School noon shift.
4. 6 students have gone to their village.

b) **Noon Shift**

First Class

1. Out of 40 students in First Class , 25 nos. have joined in Govt. School.
2. 2 nos. weak students are readmitted in First Class
3. 6 nos Children are not responding and 7 nos. have gone back to their village.

KG Class

1. Out of 40 students, 20 nos. have been mainstreamed in MCD Schools.
2. 10 nos. Students have been readmitted in First Class of the School.
3. 6 nos. students are continuing in KG Class, being underage.
4. 4 nos. Children have gone back to their village.

4.3 Kalyanpuri Centre

Basti Vikas Kendra, Near Dhobi Ghat,

Kalyanpuri, Delhi – 110091

The school has been functioning satisfactorily since November 2015. when Delhi Govt. had allotted two rooms in the local Basti Vikas Kendra in a cluster of slums .

Children in age group 4-6 years are taken in KG class and prepared for taking up further school studies.

Immediately after the school opens for a new session, the teachers regularly visit the locality households to motivate/bring the children to school.

Mainstreaming

31 children have been main streamed during the period 01.04.2023 – 31.03.2024.

Current enrolment and attendance

The enrolment went up to 45 nos. and 30-35 nos. students attended the school regularly.

Karate classes have been started on a regular basis and are held every Friday from 9 am to 10 am.

Infrastructure improvement

1. During severe winter months, curtains of transparent polythene sheets were provided at the entrance of teaching area as an additional protection from the season.
2. Wi-Fi system and CCTV is in the process of installation.

Activities in association with other organisations

1. Afternoon classes for students of Classes 5 to 8 were started by Shakti Foundation (another NGO) in the school premises. However, the classes were discontinued because of non-availability of the students.
2. A Nutrition Camp for the ladies of the locality was organized by another NGO in the school premises.

5. Closed Schools

5.1 Patparganj School

In May 1995, GODHULI started a primary school at Patparganj, East Delhi. The School was being run in a building of the MCD and GODHULI provided education, study materials and school uniform, all free. The school was discontinued w.e.f. 1st August, 2008 when all students were mainstreamed due to Government Policy.

5.2 Khichripur School

This school was started in 2009 at Khichripur, Delhi-110091 and had two KG classes for children in age group 4 to 6 years. This school had, however, to be closed w.e.f. 1st April 2014 due to withdrawal of accommodation by the authority.

5.3 Sagarpur School

The Sagarpur centre was started in 2011 in collaboration with CMM Charitable Trust, Godhuli had to terminate the arrangement due to paucity of students because of mushrooming of other Govt.schools and Aanganwadis in that area. and the centre was closed down in May '2020.

AIM

GODHULI primarily aims to provide free education to non-school going street/slum children (age four plus), as envisaged under Articles 24, 45 and 21 A of the Constitution, and the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, until they can be mainstreamed into the formal schools, and thereafter , to the extent possible, to mentor them so that they do not dropout. For selected studen6s in Classes6thto 12th, a project of proiding Tutorial Classes has also been started from January'2022.

Attendance

From its initial days, Godhuli has taken a conscious decision not to close its centres in the summer months as this ensures continuity and also a summer camp mode of learning for these children who are not visiting native place.

During normal periods, the attendance in the schools remains quite satisfactory i.e. around 85%. Children look smart in their uniforms and have shown improvement in physical appearance as also confidence of their mannerisms. Those children not going to native place, also attend our centres even in the summer months when creative activities are taught to them. All this is very encouraging to note that the children and their parents show excellent response and there are hardly any cases of students dropping out from our schools.

National Days, Festivals and Holidays

The schools normally observe Gandhi Jayanti, Independence Day, Republic Day, Diwali, Dussehra, Bal Diwas , Christmas Day New and Year Celebrations. On these occasions the School premises are decorated with flags, buntings and ballons etc.and the functions include recitation ofv patrioticsongs and dance programmesby the students followed by award of prizes to winners and distribution of sweets.

There are normally no vacations except Sundays and National and Festival Holidays., so that the children are not diverted away from education.

7. Registration under Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, FCRA and other Government Regulations

Godhuli has been registered under FCRA for accepting donations in foreign currency without prior permission from the Ministry of Home Affairs, under Registration No. 23166824 of March 2019. For this the Society has opened account no. 40108898935 in State bank of India, New Delhi main Branch. **Recognizing our very sincere efforts for educational empowerment of the underprivileged, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, vide its notification dated 11th March, 2024, has very kindly extended registration of Godhuli under FCRA for a further period of five years from 18th March 2024.**

Godhuli is additionally registered with NGO Darpan Portal of Govt. of India with ID No.DL/2018/0187530.

Godhuli also stands registered with Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) as an entity authorized to undertake CSR activities with Registration No CSR00003127

8. Exemption from Income Tax

All donations to the GODHULI are exempt from Indian Income Tax under Section 80(G) of the Act, vide order dated 02-10-2021 issued by Principal Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemptions), This exemption stands valid till Assessment Year (AY-2026-27). The Society is also registered under Clause 12 A of the IT Act for a period co-terminus with the 80G exemptions.
