Chairman's Note

Dear Stakeholders,

As many of you may be aware, GODHULI has been, over the past 30 years, educating thousands of underprivileged children and mainstreaming them to government schools. We have also been facilitating vocational training in popular Computer Courses, National Teacher's Training and Sewing Courses. A large number of our beneficiaries have now settled well in life and thank Godhuli for having laid their foundation in the early years.

The year 2024-25, when we completed three decades of existence, was a watershed year in many ways as we had quite a few firsts. We commenced pre-primary education in two centres in quick succession at Palam Gaon and Vikas Puri Basti (premises provided by Rotary Club Janak) thereby adding around 80 more children to our beneficiary list. We also facilitated a Beautician course for around 15 young women of Mirabagh/Jwala Heri area, which was a big hit with most of them beginning to earn even as they learnt. Last but not least in another first - in collaboration with Rotary Club Janak, we commenced adult education at Nangloi centre. In terms of numbers the total number of students educated in our centres stood at 574 and 52 middle and high school students were provided with tutorial education. Add to this around 40 adult education students and 30 plus students of vocational education Godhuli managed to positively touch and change for the better around 700 lives in the urban slums of Delhi NCR!

The cost of operations of Godhuli continues to be frugal wherein we have been able to limit the cost of one year's education of a child (inclusive of mid-day snacks, uniforms, books, bags, excursion trips etc) to around Rs. 8,000 - 10,000/- per child per annum. This is possible only as our teachers happily work against a modest honorarium and our Governing Body members also contribute their time and resources, without taking any compensation from the Society. Our main source of funding comes from a handful of Corporate/Institutional donors such as Container Corporation of India (CONCOR) and IRCON International (both CPSEs under Ministry of Railways), Daya Gopal Amrit Trust, Bani Jagtiani Trust and Manibhai and Brothers Charitable Trust, to name a few. This year three new Corporate donors namely M/s HB Portfolio, M/s Gateway Distriparks and M/s Ammar Frozen Foods came forward to help Godhuli, which was indeed quite encouraging for all of us. Besides various samaritans from the public including quite a few personally known to the Governing Body members have also been contributing over the years. All the same given the growing aspirations of the beneficiaries and other stake-holders, the receipt of funds from well meaning organizations and individuals are always welcome.

Chairman's Note

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I would be failing in my duties if I do not mention about the long standing support of Bhagat Chandra Hospital in providing us free of cost working office space for holding periodic meeting, storage of records and other facilitation, which saves the society significant amount of expenses.

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Our Objectives

GODHULI is a Charitable Society which was constituted in May 1994 and registered thereafter on 15.09.94, under Societies Registration Act 1860. The Society has aimed to take up projects for the basic education of street/slum children specifically those up to the age of six years. In terms of original Article 45 of the Constitution of India, (since amended vide Constitutional Amendment No. 86 of 2002 thereby making it revised article 45), making it a Fundamental Right vide Article 21 A of the Constitution and vide Right to Education Act 2010, responsibility has been placed on the State for imparting free and compulsory education to all children up to 14 years of age thereby also including by inference children upto the age of six years, a right that continues to be unfortunately deprived for many children to this day despite the efforts of the State. Godhuli endeavours to bridge this gap.







Teaching Philosophy

Teaching at Godhuli schools continues to be very interactive using practical methods. Students are learning while getting introduced to various ideas and subjects playfully and with enthusiasm. All efforts are made to increase their desire to learn in this way while at the same time they are prepared scholastically and provided with good groundwork to enhance their abilities to learn in their later years. In addition to regular teaching, the children are also taught about their surrounding environment, likely pollution of air and water and prevention of the same and cleanliness and good manners. They are also introduced to basic good habits and moral duties as also to keep themselves strong physically, mentally, socially and spiritually.

Godhuli's basic motive is to help the students develop their inherent talents as also to identify their own hidden abilities. Special efforts are also made to interact with the parents so that the teachers are getting first-hand information about the normal activities of children as also identify reasons for their occasional absence. These meetings also help the teachers to evolve ways to wean these children away from mischievous activities. The school visits also help parents get sensitized and motivated to the need for children to continue their studies. The basic idea is to initiate various efforts leading to their eventual progress in life.

The students while being given completely free education are also provided with uniforms, school bags, books, stationery and other study material free of cost. Periodic Medical checkup including eye testing and provision of spectacles is also arranged in various centres.

Summer camps are normally also held in the Schools in May and June, when other schools normally close and cover various activities of learning, reciting rhymes, colouring, chanting mantras, physical activities of dancing, playing with toys, storytelling etc.

The provision of Tutorials to students of Classes 6th to 10th has also been continued during the year to supplement the scholastic efforts at their schools. Other than classes to cover the courses, the children are routinely made to participate in quiz competition and other innovative scientific experiments to make their learning even more joyful.

Working Centres

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The following five centres operated during the year for the under privileged children. All the centres/schools are named as:

- Kalyanpuri, East Delhi
- Palam Gaon, South West Delhi
- Vikas Puri, West Delhi

Meera Bagh Centre additionally coordinates with nearby vocational training centre in providing vocational training to the youth of the area. Other than the Computer and Nursery Teachers Training, Godhuli commenced the Beautician training in which 15 young women were enrolled


Meera Bagh Centre, Meera Bagh Slums (B-Block), Paschim Vihar, West Delhi

SINCE 2000

A) Primary Education

Godhuli is running this school for poor children from slums of Meera Bagh and Paschim Vihar. The school had been running in a temporary shed located in the the area. The shed structure was renovated recently in 2020-21 and thereafter incremental improvements continue to be affected.

The centre operates over two shifts - Morning (8 AM to 12:30 PM) and Afternoon (1:00 PM to 5:00 PM) providing pre-primary and elementary education to 215 children and 90 children respectively.



DURING THIS YEAR, FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT - MEERA BAGH

- **Art & Craft summer camp (15th May to 15 June 2024)**

Art and craft workshop was organized in which students from classes 1st to 3rd actively participated and demonstrated their ability. Activities included reading, writing, drawing competition, Sports and Quiz competitions.

- **Yoga Day (21st June 2024)**

For betterment of the body and mind of students of school a session on yoga was held on International Yoga Day in which various Asanas, Pranayam, Meditation etc. were demonstrated to and practiced by them.

- **Plantation (27th July 2024)**

A tree plantation program was organized by Godhuli Society at Meerabagh Center in which Godhuli Governing Body members, Children and all teachers and staff participated. Planting trees can save environment and also make air clean.

- **Karate Competition (09th August 2024)**

Five students from Godhuli school participated in 6th international karate competition, Which was organized by Sanford world School in Sector – 57 , Nodia. Three students among them earned medals, Piyush won silver medal and Sudhakar won bronze medal.

- **Independence Day**

Independence Day was celebrated on 14th August 2024 in the presence of Godhuli Executives and other guests who appreciated the spirited performance of the children and encouraged them.

- **Self Defense Workshop (17th August 2024)**

The Students were sent to Rise sports school indoor stadium at sector – 37, Noida from Godhuli Meerabagh. Students Saw badminton court, physical exercises, gym, archery. The students were taught about self defense training and also provided afternoon lunch.

- **Teachers Day (5th September 2024)**

On teachers day students were told about Dr. Sarvepalli Radha Krishna and many students sang song & poem during this session. Teachers were duly appreciated for their contribution in guiding the students.

- **Health Camp (14th Sep. 2024)**

An Eye Checkup Camp was organized for the students of the centre for awareness regarding their eyes care by Mahavir International Delhi. In this camp doctor examined the school children for their eyes and other ophthalmic related issue. Spectacles were given to 10 children.

- **Clay Workshop (28th September 2024)**

Godhuli organized a clay workshop for the students. The students were taught to make different shapes like headphones, Flower etc. from clay.

- **Gandhi Jayanti (2nd October 2024)**

On the event of Gandhi Jayanti a function was held in remembrance of the Father of the Nation. Sweets were distributed amongst the students. Further in order to enhance awareness amongst the whole community as well as the students of the school and otherwise, a Prabhat Feri was conducted in which all the students at the school participated.

- **Teacher's Workshop (05th October 2024)**

Godhuli organised a teacher's workshop for the teachers of Godhuli society. The Godhuli Governing Body members explained various topics to the teachers for their teaching. They discussed on Teacher Learning Material Activities, Yoga and Meditation, Handwriting; Phonetic Sounds, importance of Hindi and the rules & amp; responsibilities of teachers. The resource person, Ms. Pinky (SPYM NGO) discussed on "Drug Addiction" and "Good touch & Bad Touch".

- **Laughter Workshop (17th October 2024)**

Godhuli organized a Laughter workshop for the students of Godhuli School. Students were taught with the help of activities like singing, clapping, etc. to integrate Laughter in little - little things like hand shaking, brushing etc.

- **Diwali (30th October 2024)**

Sweets Were distributed by Dr. Navdip Kaur, General Secretary Godhuli and Mr. K. Narayan, Treasurer, Godhuli.

- **Children's Day (14 November 2024)**

In the memory of Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, a cultural programme was conducted in which all the students of the school participated & enjoyed. On this day brief information about some of the great deeds accomplished by Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru were also shared with students. At the end of the programme the participants were distributed sweets. A quiz competition was organised for the students of 6th to 9th classes undergoing tutorial education at the centre.

- **Health Camp (4th Jan 2025)**

An Eye Checkup camp was organized for the students of the school for awareness regarding their eyes care by Mahavir International Delhi. In this camp doctor examined the school children for their eyes and other ophthalmic related issue. Spectacles were given to 10 children.

- **Republic Day (25th Jan 2025)**

Republic day was celebrated by both shifts students in the presence of Godhuli Governing Body members and teachers and staff.

- **Supervisory Visit (08th Feb. 2025)**

A supervisory visit was done by Concor in which inspection was done in each and every class to assess performance of students. The problems and issues in terms of running of the centre were discussed during the visit and assured for proper action in this regard.

- **In March 2025 Exams were held.**

- **Karate training for students has been introduced since 2018-2019 session**

Every student of the center is given training once a week. This has improved general, physical and mental strength of students and improved their general confidence level. Children observed with more talent are being given extra training for participation in competitions.

To the existing pool of around 500 books, 400 books have been added in the student library. Weekly distribution of books is being done for class 3rd children by rotation.

DETAILS OF MAINSTREAMING OF CHILDREN OF MEERA BAGH CENTRE

- **Morning Shift**

Out of 215 children enrolled, 137 students were mainstreamed into nearby MCD schools. 96 Students were promoted to 1st, 2nd and 3rd classes. 26 students are continuing in KG and 1st due to being underage and requiring further academic inputs.

- **Afternoon Shift**

Out of 90 children enrolled, 18 students were selected for mainstreaming in MCD schools. 36 Students were promoted to 1st class and 28 students were promoted to 2nd and 3rd. 08 students are continuing in KG for same reasons as mentioned above.

Meera Bagh Centre, Meera Bagh Slums (B-Block), Paschim Vihar, West Delhi

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VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRES

A) Computer Literacy Programme

With a view to enhance skills of the students and to make them fit for gainful employment, computer training programme for 12th pass students is conducted. This training for students from the slums was started in the year 2009 with only 6 students. It is a matter of great satisfaction that so far seventeen batches totaling 496 students who have undergone these computer courses, most of who have been able to get gainful employment. They are being regularly guided towards a respectable and bright future. All expenses for these courses are met with by Godhuli.

During the year 2024-25, the 16th and 17th batch comprising a total of 12 students were successfully trained and certified in Certificate in Advanced Computer Software (CACCS), Diploma in Additional Financial Accounting (DAFA) and Web Designing

B) Nursery Teacher Training (NTT)

It had been observed that some young women residing in slum areas want to adopt Teaching as a profession. This prompted Godhuli to start the first batch of the one-year Nursery Teacher's Training (NTT) courses for 10 students in August 2016. Five batches have been completed so far. All expenses for these courses (except for some petty consumables) are met by Godhuli. Another course was commenced during the year.

C) Beautician Training Course

With a view to enhance skills of the students and to make them fit for gainful employment, Beautician Training Course was commenced in Dec. 2024 with 15 students. It is a matter of great satisfaction that the students who have undergone the Beautician course are already either self employed or getting gainful employment. They continue to be guided towards a respectable and bright future. All expenses for these courses (except for some petty consumables) are met by Godhuli.

Meera Bagh Centre, Meera Bagh Slums (B-Block), Paschim Vihar, West Delhi

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TUTORIAL EDUCATION

Encouraged by the results, tutorial education was continued, but this time around with the help of grant of a new donor namely Rajdhani Flour Mills Ltd. in which 52 students of classes 6th to 10th were enrolled. The classes are taken by professional tutors involve not only remedial education in the conventional subjects, but also other initiatives like experiments to prove scientific facts, quizzes etc to make school education more interesting. All the students have been promoted to next classes, with most registering healthy improvement in all three subjects.



This school in Nangloi was started in April, 2016 for KG class for street / slum children of the area after entering into an agreement with the Saini family who have made available their premises for the said activity.

Learning at Godhuli is multifaceted as we encourage the students to improve their knowledge, basic habits and moral duties while growing strong physically, mentally, socially and spiritually. Within a short span of time, the school has gained immense popularity among the underprivileged population of the area.

DURING THIS YEAR, FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT - NANGLOI

The centre operates over two shifts - morning (8 AM to 12:00 PM) and Afternoon (12:30 PM to 04:30 PM) providing pre-primary and elementary education to 105 children and 80 children respectively.

- **Yoga Day (21th June 2024)**

For betterment of health of students of schools, a session on yoga was held in which various Asanas Pranayama meditation etc. were practiced by them.

- **Health Check-up Camp (31st July 2024)**

The health check up camp was organized by Rotary Club Janakpuri with Apollo Hospital. In this camp parent's of children studying in Godhuli and people of the area were examined by the doctor including different measures like blood sugar level, blood pressure, ECG, etc. Also distribution of sanitary pads was done. Total no. of Registration done - 60.

- **Independence Day** was celebrated on 13th August 2024 in the presence of Godhuli Executives.

- **Teachers Day (5th September 2024)**

Teachers were told about Dr. Sarvepalli Radha Krishna and Many students sang song & poem during this session. Teachers were duly appreciated for their contribution in guiding the students.

- **Now for the students from 4-7yrs of age**, we are having two classes of KG and First in the noon shift.

- **Eye Check-up Camp (01st October 2024)**

An Eye Check-up Camp was organized for the students of the school for awareness regarding their eyes care by Mahavir International Delhi. In this camp doctor examined the school children for their eyes and other ophthalmic related issue. Spectacles were given to 02 children. No. of Registration done - Children's - 83 and Parents - 25.

- **Karate classes** were continued for both shifts students on every Wednesday.

- **Dussehra: (11th October 2024)**

It is a major Hindu festival celebrated at the end of Navratri every year. Chocolates were distributed among the students and wished them joyful Dusshera.

- **Diwali (30th October 2024)**

Sweets were distributed by Ms Santosh Bansal, Governing Body member.

- **Children's Day (14th November 2024)**

On this celebration some kids came in the dress of white kurta as Pandit Nehru used to wear. The school premises was decorated with flags, balloons and ribbons, flowers sketched and coloured by students. Children recited rhymes, sang patriotic birthday songs.

- **Christmas Day** was celebrated on 24th Dec 2024.

- **Eye Checkup Camp (07th January 2025)**

An Eye Checkup camp was organized for the children of the school for the awareness regarding their eyes care by Mahavir International Delhi. In this camp doctor examined the school children for their eyes and other ophthalmic issues. Spectacles were given to one child only. No. of Registration Student's - 85 and Parent's - 32 .

- **Republic Day (25 January 2025)**

Republic Day was celebrated by both shifts students combined in the presence of Godhuli Executive and Saini family members .

- **On 30th January 2025** students prayed in the remembrance of Rashtrapita Mahatma Gandhi's 77th "PUNYA THITHI"

- **Basant Panchami (01st February 2025)**

Basant Panchami was celebrated amongst the students of the school in order to enhance the spirit & importance of this festival in their life. In this celebration all students prayed for Goddess Saraswati with joy & happiness.

- **Holi (12th March 2025)**

It marks the end of winters and the beginning of summer. Children were told to bring gujiya and sweets in their lunch box. They all played with flower and participated in pichkari party.

- **In March 2025 Exams were held** and Art & craft, Sports Day was organized.

Morning Shift

Out of 105 children enrolled, 96 students were selected for mainstreaming in other schools, 06 shifted in 1st class in noon shift and 03 children are continuing in KG class due to under age.

Afternoon Shift

Out of 80 children enrolled, 60 students were selected for mainstreaming in other schools, 10 Children shifted in 1st class in Afternoon shift and 10 children are continuing in KG class due to under age.

Kalyanpuri Centre - Basti Vikas Kendra, Near Dhobi Ghat, Kalyanpuri, Delhi – 110091

SINCE 2015

The school has been functioning satisfactorily since November 2015. when Delhi Govt. had allotted two rooms in the local Basti Vikas Kendra in a cluster of slums.

Children in age group 4-6 years are taken in KG class and prepared for taking up further school studies.

Immediately after the school opens for a new session, the teachers regularly visit the locality households to motivate/bring the children to school.

Mainstreaming

18 children were main streamed during the period 01.04.2024 – 31.03.2025.

Current enrolment and attendance

35 – 40 children were enrolled during the year 2024-2025 and 30-35 children attended the school regularly.



The Palam Gaon centre was being planned since long, but was deferred due to Covid outbreak. The Centre started functioning from July 2024 in rented premises at WZ-24 A, Adarsh Gali, Palam Village. The efforts of Dr. Bhagat, and his team were instrumental in making this possible. The area has many street dwellers and migrant daily wagers, so their children are expected to patronise the school and take benefit of the facilities.


Two fresh teachers were recruited, and trained at Meerabagh, and have been working continuously with great dedication. Senior teachers from Meerabagh and other centres, and Governing Council members regularly visit the centre to guide the teachers on curriculum, and other activities standardised at older centres. One Attendant is also working continuously.

Two Classrooms have been equipped with blackboards, benches and tables. There is also a common room for other activities like prayer, PT etc. The standard norms followed at other centres like providing uniforms, books, bags, and a morning snack are being maintained.

The capacity of the school is kept at 50, in two sections. The smaller children (upto 4-5 years of age) are in the KG-A section, and the older ones are in KG-B section. KG-B has children of varying ages, some upto 10-11 years of age who require special, and separate teaching. However, no children desirous of admission are turned back, although this creates some problems. Although enrolment of upto 45 children took place within the first 2-3 months, there has been regular drop-outs resulting in an average daily attendance of between between 20-25.

The school celebrated Independence Day and Republic Day, and Teachers Day with great enthusiasm.

8 children were mainstreamed in the first session itself in nearby MCD schools. What was even more satisfying is that some of these children were of the ge group of 8 to 10 years, who had stopped going to school for a variety of reasons. Their re-admission was a culmination of dedicated efforts of the teachers to not only bring them to the level of their class, but to also counsel and motivate their parents to put them back in school.



Vikas Puri Centre - Basti Vikas Kendra, Indira Camp-2, Vikas Puri, New Delhi - 110018

SINCE 2024

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This school in Vikas Puri was inaugurated on 28th June, 2024 by PDG Ramesh Chander, Chairman, Adult Literacy, RILM and PP Anil Kakar, Disttt. Chair, Adult Literacy, Distt 3011 for the age group of slum children from 4 to 6 years. The school started functioning from 1st July, 2024. The space for the school has kindly been provided by Rotary Club of Delhi Janakpuri. The guests were given a grand welcome by the children of Meera Bagh who sung a song. Also children had displayed Karate skills.

This premises has been divided into two classes, KG-A (catering for children in the age group 4 to 5 years) & KG-B (for children in the age group 5 to 6 years). The Centre started with just 20 children. Soon with the amenities such as tables/chairs, swings made available to the Centre by Rotary, gradually attracted more enrollment and by the end of academic year, the strength went up to 45 children. Subsequently, other facilities such as Wifi connection, CCTV camera & a TV set were provided by the Godhuli Management.

Out of 45 children, 30 children have been mainstreamed to MCD/Private/Village schools. 11 have been retained in the school due to underage. 4 children could not be mainstreamed due to lack of parents' cooperation. So these 4 children are presently retained in Vikas Puri centre only.

Learning at Vikas Puri Centre has been skill oriented, focussing on the all round development of each and every child (catering for individual differences). The teaching methodologies are activity/game based where the children do and learn and discover for themselves. Majority of parents preferred this Centre to Bal Vatika.

DURING THIS YEAR, FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT - VIKAS PURI

- **Independence Day**

Independence Day was celebrated on 13th August 2024 in the presence of Godhuli Executives. The flag was hoisted by our Chairman Dr. Y.P. Anand. Dr. Navdeep Kaur & Shri Narayan were also present at the function. Children had put up a grand show and recited patriotic poems. They also danced to the tune of the song "Desh Mera Rangeela". Tri-colour bands were made by them, which they tied on their wrists. The school was decorated with Tri-colour balloons, badges and flags. The children were given Tiffin Boxes and eats by the guests.

- **Janmashtami** festival was celebrated on 24th August, 2024. Few children had come dressed as Lord Krishna and Radha and a dance performance was done on the song “Radha Teri Chunri”. A Jhoola was made and an Idol of Bal Gopal was placed in it. Turn by turn every child got a chance to swing the Jhoola. A paper matka was also made and hung on the top, which children tried to reach.
- **Karate Classes** for children was introduced from the month of August, 2024. Regular classes were held on every Thursday. A special coach Mr. Bobby was appointed for the same. Children participated with great enthusiasm.
- **Teachers Day** was celebrated on 5th September 2024. Children were told about Dr. Sarvepalli Radha Krishnan and they sung a poem during this occasion. Children also made out cards for teachers. After children’s departure, teachers had a small party.
- **Ganesh Chaturthi** was celebrated on 7th September, 2024. A wall hanging Ganeshji was made. Children were briefed about Lord Ganesha. Children were taught to make Ganesha with paper cups.
- **First Terminal Examination** was held from 19th to 25th September on the subjects English, Hindi, Maths, Science, G.K. and Drawing. After the exam, various competitions (A matching Game on numbers using flash cards, balls & baskets, Concentration Game using bottles, Musical Chair) were held from 26th to 28th September, 2024 and prizes were distributed to the winners. PTM was held on the 30th September where progress reports were distributed.
- **Gandhi Jayanthi** was celebrated on 1st October, 2024. Children came dressed as the three monkeys of Gandhiji and narrated the favourite dialogue “Na sun bura, na dekh bura, na bhol bura”. One child came dressed as Bapu and poems on Bapu were recited.
- A **Workshop** was conducted on 5th October, 2024 at Godhuli, Meera Bagh and all the teachers of Vikas Puri Kendra had attended the workshop.
- **Dussehra Festival** was celebrated on 11th October 2024. Children were briefed about the festival. A discussion was held on how & why Dussehra is celebrated. At the end children were distributed chocolates.

- **Diwali Festival** was celebrated on 30th October, 2024. Rangoli was made outside the class, using different flowers and leaves and a Kalash was placed in the middle. Mithai Dabbas were distributed to the children and teachers were also given gifts.
- **Children’s Day** was celebrated on 14th November 2024. Three children came dressed as Chacha Nehru. Nehru caps were made and given to all the children. An activity on paper folding of Rose(Origami) was done. About 15 Rotarians had come and they distributed refreshments to children. Also on this eve, they donated sports items like shuttle cock, hula-hoop, Carrom Board etc.
- **Janetri Workshop** - Mahavir International organised a successful Workshop for pregnant/lactating mothers on 23rd November, 2024 at Basti Vikas Kendra, Indira Camp, Vikas Puri, sponsored by CONCOR. It was attended by teachers of Basti Vikas Kendra (Ms. Kavita, Ms. Kusum, Ms.Tanisha & Mr. Subhodh). Anganwadi Incharge and Rtn. Dr. Indu had also attended. Total 30 mothers had registered for this Workshop. The Woman Health Counselor shared useful information through video clips. During the interactive session, many experiences were shared by the beneficiaries. Dr. Indu had also donated clothes for children in the age group 3 months to 1 year. Goody bags which included baby kits, sanitary napkins, kaala chana, groundnuts & sattu packets were distributed to all the beneficiaries.
- **Christmas Day** was celebrated on 24th December, 2024. 4-5 children came dressed as Santa Claus. Christmas songs were played on the television and children danced to the tunes. As an activity children made Christmas Cards. A Christmas party was held, cake was cut and refreshments served.

Registration under FCRA and other Government Regulations

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
Godhuli has been registered under Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 1976 for accepting donations in foreign currency without prior permission from the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) under Registration No. 23166824 of March 2019, which has been duly extended by MHA for a further period of five years vide their notification dated 11th March, 2024. The Society has opened account no. 40108898935 in State bank of India, New Delhi main Branch for receiving the foreign funds and has been regularly submitting its annual returns to MHA - the last one being in December 2024.

Godhuli is additionally registered with NGO Darpan Portal of Govt. of India with ID No.DL/2018/0187530.

Godhuli also stands registered with Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) as an entity authorized to undertake CSR activities with Registration No CSR00003127

Exemption from Income Tax

All donations to the GODHULI are exempt from Indian Income Tax under Section 80(G) of the Act, vide order dated 02-10-2021 issued by Principal Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemptions), The exemptions stand valid till Assessment Year (AY-2026-27). The Society is also registered under Clause 12 A of the IT Act for a period co-terminus with the 80G exemptions.

Tasks for next year

During the next year, the Society plans to improve the effectiveness of the current interventions besides actively looking for new initiatives. We also hope to bring in new donors to our fold, so that our beneficiaries can further benefit - both from the financial contributions for their educational empowerment as also by way of engagement with persons from the mainstream of the society. Some of the specific tasks include:

- To ensure that children of centres at MeeraBagh and Nangloi continue to work at the current optimum capacity - with better quality teaching inputs, given that all teachers have now undergone NTT course
- To mobilise children for the three smaller centres of Kalyanpuri, Palam gaon and Vikas Puri such that their numbers can reach near capacity of 50. Towards the same a section for young school dropouts of the ages 7-10 years can also be started followed by their mainstreaming into conventional schools
- To continue the vocational education interventions for underprivileged youth of the Meerabagh/Nangloi area in Computers, Beautician and NTT as per demand.
- To start new intervention like remedial education or adult education in consultation with Rotary Club Janak
- Arrange regular Medical check-up camps for students.
- To strengthen the involved systems for the Tutorial Classes at Meerabagh by way of increase in number of students, adequacy of attendance, systematic follow-up of the syllabus and involvement of parents, with the objective of ensuring all round improvement in the results
